

BELIEFS ABOUT THE ROLE OF HUMAN ACTIVITY IN CLIMATE CHANGE



VIEWS ON THE GLOBAL ENVIRONMENT

Around two-thirds of people living in Jersey believe the climate is changing and human activity is mainly responsible, compared to 58% in Guernsey and half of the Isle of Man residents.

VIEWS ABOUT AVOIDING THE EFFECTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE (% of those who believe the climate is changing)

believe "We are still able to avoid the worst effects of climate change but it would need a drastic change in the steps taken"





12% believe "It is already too late to avoid the worst effects of climate change"

N.B. A small proportion of people do not believe it is necessary to take any steps to 'avoid the worst effects of climate change'



'DOING MORE TO TACKLE CLIMATE CHANGE': VIEWS ON OUR RESPONSIBILITY AS (% of those who believe the climate is changing)

...An Island: 8 out of 10 residents believe Jersey could be doing more to tackle climate change, which is slightly higher than in Guernsey and the Isle of Man (76% and 71% respectively).

...Individuals: 42% of Isle of Man residents believe they, personally, are already doing as much as they reasonably can (or need to), compared to 39% of Guernsey and 36% of Jersey residents.



The 'Climate Change' survey was undertaken by Island Global Research in November 2019. The survey was completed by 2,399 residents in the Crown Dependencies (834 Guernsey, 838 Jersey and 718 Isle of Man). *Results of an International survey on climate change that was undertaken in 28 countries were published by YouGov in September 2019.

RECYCLE



Reduce waste, re-use/upcycle Ethical Consumer / buy less / buy eco-friendly, and/or re-usable products Avoid excessive packaging / minimise plastics Shop local / grow own food Buy less clothing / buy more second-hand items Reduce/cut out meat, dairy



BUS, CYCLE OR WALK (MORE)

Use low emission vehicle / smaller vehicle/ hybrid car Moved from diesel vehicle to petrol one Currently use or are looking into buying an electric vehicle Limit off-island travel Use car less/ plan journeys to reduce fuel use/ car share

ENERGY CONSUMPTION



Use or changing to a more environmentally friendly source of heating Turn heating down when possible Use /considering use of technology around the home to be energy efficient and/or generate own electricity e.g. Heat pump, solar panels, Eco-home construction methods Energy efficient household items e.g. lighting, appliances Improved home insulation Careful with/monitor/ reduce energy use around the home in general Reducing carbon footprint where possible

Wildlife friendly gardening/planting/ tree planting Carbon offsetting through green projects Do not use aerosols
